October 31, 2017 marked the 500th Anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. Since that time, Catholics have often viewed the idea of “reform” with a certain suspicion and reluctance. At the same time, the season of Lent calls Christians to introspection, penance and new life. He received his doctorate in the History of Christianity from the University of Notre Dame and specializes in medieval and Reformation thought with particular focus on the theology of Saint Thomas Aquinas and Saint Bonaventure. He has several publications including recent articles in "Nova et Vetera," "Zeitschrift für Neuere Theologiegeschichte" and "Archa Verbi."
